

READING LISTS



The best place to start finding information sources for an assignment is the reading list that your tutor has supplied for a programme or module. This will show the key and background books and other resources that you are encouraged to read to understand a topic and to refer to in your own writing. These are carefully selected sources that should be available from the library or online.


LIBRARY

In the library books are arranged into subject areas using the Dewey Decimal Classification system. Each book has a classmark number on the spine to indicate where it is located, e.g. Cottrell, S. (2019) The study skills handbook. London: Palgrave Macmillan is located at classmark 371.170281 COT You will find other books on the subject of study skills located on the same library shelf.



Note that in Augustine House the numerical sequence is repeated twice on each floor, with 7 days loan books on the shelves down the room and 4 week loan books located on the moving shelves at the end of the room.

LIBRARY SEARCH



CCCU LibrarySearch is the library's resource discovery system which enables you to find recommended books and other research materials. It contains the library catalogue, which tells you what is in the campus libraries at Augustine House in Canterbury, Drill Hall Library at Medway and Salomons Library in Tunbridge Wells. It also gives you access to subscribed ebooks, online journals and database collections. Always Log In to LibrarySearch with your CCCU username and password to gain full access to resources.
