Following three successful hybrid events, the Simulation4MentalHealth team designed a unique mental health simulation-based online education programme which was run on two occasions via MS Teams.

The painstakingly designed day, targeted towards a diverse audience: multi-agency professionals across the country, provided a unique opportunity for collaborative meaningful shared learning. Participants included police officers, Drs, Allied Health Professionals – including paramedics & occupational therapists, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, physician associates, and experts by lived experience.

This co-production involved the S4MH Fellows working with experts by lived experience of mental and physical health, including carers and service users, in design and faculty delivery, to achieve an authentic, holistic experience and was integral to S4MH ethos and the process of influencing change, tackling stigma, and growing empathy.

The S4MH Team received overwhelmingly positive feedback about the programmes, highlighting impact and value of working in faculty partnership with experts by lived experience, as well as the multi-agency collaborative learning approach. 100% of attendees would recommend the course to colleagues.

XR Hubs Pilot

XR Hubs are a lending library of augmented and virtual reality technology equipment and software applications, including content creation packs. Access is coordinated in conjunction with HEE regional office representatives. The XR Hub is currently in pilot phase and so access is mediated through the regional Simulation TEL leads and networks. What is the XR Hub Pilot?

- Opportunity to try Headsets before you buy them and for us to test the logistics of sending them out supporting their deployment and getting them back.
- · Phase 1 was a set of Hololens 2 (Mixed Reality)
- Phase 2 is a set of HTC Vive Focus 3 (Wireless Virtual Reality)
- · Phase 3 will be a set of RiVR Pico G2 4K (Wireless all in one classroom kits with a laptop)
